He was blessed with a brilliant mind, but lacked any common sense. Robert was the epitome of a dysfunctional, unheralded genius. And, due to all of the above, he was to a large extent, misunderstood.

So let me share the things that I understand and know to be true about my brother. He was weird and wonderful. Very much a unique individual! He sought out, treasured, and cultivated the unusual, the odd, the eccentric things in life and, in the process, he broadened our horizons. He hated pretense and hypocrisy. A true non-conformist. He loved books, the written word. The Webster's dictionary was his favorite book. He was a Scrabble aficionado and a gifted writer. An excellent student, he studied Latin in high school and loved mathematic equations. Movies were his passion.

He enjoyed all kinds of music and to this day, my daughter and I treasure and enjoy the works of the artists that he 'turned us on to'. He was something of a purist. He loved iced tea and considered it contaminated if it had lemon or sugar. Chinese food, catfish and a good old monster movie were the joys of his life. As you probably know, fishing was his favorite pastime, and he was good at it. The things he loved enough to do, he did with excellence.

He didn't have a lot of friends, but those he had, he loved, cherished and looked after with great diligence. They knew that anything they ask of Robert, he would do. He was fiercely protective of his loved ones and had a great capacity for love. My daughter, Lindsay, was the apple of his eye. The day she was born, he came to the hospital with a brand new cane fishing pole as her 'welcome to the world' gift. He wanted to share his loves with her, and he did, much to her delight. As she will tell you, the admiration and love was mutual. When we were blessed with Grace, he greeted and treated her with the same enthusiasm and love. To him, they were known as 'Boog' and 'Boogette'. As a bit of comic relief, I'll tell you that I had several nicknames...none of which can be shared with decent company!

I would also like to give any of you that are concerned about Robert's final destination peace. He was a man of faith. He shared his beliefs with me and others

close to him. I have no doubt that he, Mom, Aunt Anne, all of our loved ones are having a picnic beside the still waters in heaven as we gather here this evening. There is music, laughter, dancing and a baited fishing pole leaned on an oak tree. Our sorrow tonight is for ourselves, for they are in celebration. In summary, I think the central theme of Robert's life was this... Dare to be different, be proud of you are, Because therein lies the spice, the joy, the pleasure of living! So when you have time and you think of Robert, fill a glass with Your favorite beverage and raise it to Robert Lee Cover, my brother, my kindred spirit. Carpe Diem!
